

Halls Head College Good Standing

Rationale

The concept of Good Standing is to acknowledge and reward those students who display the College's core values of Care, Courage, and Commitment and to encourage other students to improve their overall performance.

Students retain their Good Standing by demonstrating the College's expected behaviours. These include, but are not limited to:

Attendance	Attendance rate greater than 90% and consistently punctual to class.	
Behaviour	Adhering to the PBS Behaviour Matrix	
Uniform	Meets the requirements of the College Uniform Policy.	

Maintaining Good Standing allows students to participate in but is not limited to the following:

 Excursions, Tours, and Camps 	 Representing the school in external activities
Reward Activities	 Social Activities
 Leaver's Activities 	 College Student Leadership Roles

Procedure

If students are unable to maintain their Good Standing status, the Year Coordinator will negotiate the targets and timeframes that need to be met for Good Standing to be reinstated.

Negotiations may include, but not limited to, a variety of tasks to achieve the targets such as:

Behaviour Card	 Arranged number of positive SEQTA entries
Attendance Card	 Meeting Set Targets

Notification

Students and their families will be notified by letter, generated from SEQTA, that the student has lost their Good Standing. The letter will include the timeframe and student expectations before reinstatement of Good Standing can be achieved. Students and their families will also be notified via SEQTA when Good Standing is reinstated.
